Antibiotic Prophylaxis Regimen

<u>Pre-procedure antibiotics MUST BE TAKEN FOR THE REST</u> <u>OF YOUR LIFE FOR ALL</u> routine dental cleaning, dental work and colonoscopies.

- Patients not allergic to Penicillin, Cephalexin, Cephradine or Amoxicillin: 2 grams of Amoxicillin orally 1 hour prior to procedure
- Patients allergic to Penicillin: Clindamycin 600mg orally 1 hour prior to procedure
- Patients not allergic to Penicillin, BUT are unable to take oral medications: Cefazolin 1 gram, OR Ampicillin 2 grams IM/IV 1 hour prior to procedure
- Patients allergic to Penicillin and unable to take oral medications:
 Clindamycin 600 mg IM/IV 1 hour prior to procedure

You must take antibiotic one hour prior to any dental appointment or colonoscopy for the rest of your life Even though this may conflict with what your dentist or gastroenterologist says

Additionally, prior to any urological, gastrointestinal or surgical procedure you must notify your doctor that you have a joint replacement. You may need to take antibiotics to protect the prosthesis from infection.
